

GUIDED SELF-PLACEMENT

Beginning Summer 2025, MATH 156 and above will continue to use placement scores/prerequisite courses to place students. However, MATH 150 and below will use Guided Self-Placement (GSP) to help students self-select their math course(s). Below are additional ways the College can help support you in MATH 150 and below.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU NEED HELP WITH PLACEMENT IN ENGLISH AND MATH

- **Beginning of Semester.** If you are unsure of placement during the first few weeks of the semester, talk with your instructor about a course level transfer to add a support class if appropriate (and available). Contact your instructor if you are enrolled in the pair of courses but feel you could be successful in the standalone course. The instructor initiates this course level transfer using the ARE form, and you must approve this action through the link sent to you by Admissions, Registration, and Records (ARR).

- **Mid-Semester Withdrawals.**
 - You can't withdraw from a course in a corequisite pair on your own. You have the option to withdraw from the college level course while completing the support course but this must be initiated by the instructor submitting the CDW (course directed withdrawal) form. This form is sent directly to ARR. Note: this must be completed by the withdrawal deadline for that course.
 - If you withdraw completely from math, you can work to improve your math skills with:
 - **Gateway to College Math (GCM)** - The Math coach Mindy Bertch will enroll you and then work with Sheila Eisenhower who is the coordinator for GCM.
 - **ALEKS PPL Modules** - this can be worked on with tutors in the Math Center, with the Math coach Mindy Bertch, or worked on independently at home
