Kalamazoo Valley offers one of the lowest tuition rates in the state but paying for college can be difficult. The Student Financial Services provides numerous options to assist you with the costs associated with attending Kalamazoo Valley including need-based and merit-based scholarships, grants and other financial aid opportunities.

HELP PAYING FOR COLLEGE

MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

High school seniors may apply for this scholarship. Awards are based on students' academic achievement.

TRUSTEE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR EDUCATION FOR EMPLOYMENT (EFE)

Awarded to graduating seniors who participated in an Education for Employment course through KRESA.

TRUSTEE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR HIGH SCHOOL/ADULT EDUCATION GRADUATES

Students are nominated by their high school counselor, principal or instructor. Awarded to graduating high school seniors or adult education students from an in-district high school or adult education center.

TRUSTEE ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIP

Funds are available to selected athletes participating in intercollegiate athletic events scheduled by the college.

TRUSTEE HONORS PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded annually to students selected for the Honors Program who are working toward an associate degree in any field.

KVCC FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The KVCC Foundation funds more than 60 different scholarships for current Kalamazoo Valley students.

MICHIGAN ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

The Michigan Achievement Scholarship is for first-year undergraduate students who are admitted to a degree program and can provide up to \$2,750 a year in support. Seventy percent of Michigan high school graduates are eligible.

KALAMAZOO VALLEY ACCELERATED ASSOCIATE PROGRAM (KVAAP)

The Kalamazoo Valley Accelerated Associate Program (KVAAP) covers the cost of tuition, fees, books and required supplies for its participants. The program ensures that students stay on track to obtain their associate degree at an accelerated pace by attending school full time. Learn more at www.kvcc.edu/kvaap.

MICHIGAN RECONNECT

Kalamazoo Valley encourages Michigan residents who are 21 and older who do not have an associate or bachelor's degree to apply for the Michigan Reconnect program. Michigan Reconnect pays the remaining balance of in-district tuition and mandatory fees after other state and federal financial aid have been applied. Students who attend out-of-district community colleges will receive a large tuition discount. Learn more at www.kvcc.edu/reconnect.

DEBT FORGIVENESS PROGRAM

Students who left Kalamazoo Valley without a degree and debt to the college may qualify for the Debt Forgiveness program. Through the program, the college will forgive up to \$2,500 of a student's past due balance upon successful completion of a degree or certificate – 50% of the debt upon successful completion of 12 credits or program completion (whichever occurs first) and the remaining 50% upon successful attainment of a certificate or degree. BECOME A STUDENT

ADMISSION

Complete a free application online at www.kvcc.edu/apply. Be sure to identify your program of interest or select undecided if you are unsure at this time. You will receive an acceptance letter within two weeks.

ASSESSMENT

Course prerequisites are enforced at Kalamazoo Valley which requires assessment of your placement level prior to registering for classes. There are three ways you can satisfy this requirement:

- SAT/ACT scores - Kalamazoo Valley accepts ACT scores and the new SAT scores from tests taken within the last two years. Submit your scores to Student Development Services at success@kvcc.edu.
- Placement Test - complete the free placement test given on a walk-in basis in our Testing Centers.
- College courses - have completed a college level English and/or math class at another institution with a grade of 2.0/C or better, or have earned a bachelor's degree or higher as identified on the Kalamazoo Valley application.

FINANCIAL AID

If you are pursuing a degree or certificate and plan to apply for financial aid, it is important that you complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA™) at fafsa.gov as soon as possible to start the financial aid process. Kalamazoo Valley's federal school code is 006949.

NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION

Attending orientation is mandatory for all new students. At orientation, you will be introduced to the Kalamazoo Valley campus and the services available to you.

REGISTER

Register for classes online in MyValley or by coming on campus during posted registration hours. Registration begins in March for summer, April for fall, October for winter and continues through the start of classes.

STUDENT ID

Request your Valley ID card in your MyValley account. A student ID is needed to use many services. At the Arcadia Commons Campus, it is required for parking validation and door access.

TUITION

Tuition bills are available online in your MyValley account. Pay for your classes online, on campus or by mail during deferred payment periods. Payment plan options are available.
